Town, County Call for Moratorium on Offshore Wind Projects

Officials in Berkeley are joining county officials in calling for a moratorium on offshore wind projects, saying that more study should be done before these projects move forward.

At the moment, there are three offshore wind projects in the planning stages set to be off the coast of New Jersey, including one off the coast of Long Beach Island.

Mayor Carmen Amato and the town council joined with 30 mayors throughout the shore region, as well as the Ocean County Board of Commissioners, to call for more studies before these wind projects move forward.

"It appears the noise disruption to whales has been significantly underestimated and should be further evaluated to ensure that the whale species is adequately protected from such disturbance," reads a resolution passed by the town council and sent to Governor Phil Murphy and President Joe Biden. "The Mayor and Township Council are deeply concerned by the number of recent whale deaths and the ultimate impact to the whale population if these numbers continue."

The issue has received increased attention in recent months thanks to whale strandings on state beaches, though the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, National Wildlife Federation, Sierra Club, and Natural Resources Defense Council all say the issues are unrelated. Several of the stranded whales showed evidence of ship strikes and entanglement with fishing equipment.

County officials cited an array of concerns, including how visible wind turbines would be from the shore and their impact on New Jersey's \$2.5 billion fishing industry.

"There are clearly growing concerns over these projects," Ocean County Commissioner Joseph H. Vicari said. "We need to know more about the potential impact on the environment and the economy before this goes any farther."

Another frequently aired concern, which the Commissioners outlined in a resolution also sent to Murphy and Biden, is what impact seeing turbines could have on shore tourism, one of the economic lifebloods of the region.

"Residents and business owners have concerns about the irrevocably negative impact on the coastal viewshed that will result from the turbines being visible from Long Beach Island and other oceanfront beach locations and how this visual pollution will affect tourism and local property values," the resolution reads.

There are at least three offshore wind projects in the works. The one called Atlantic Shores, which would be located off Long Beach Island, has raised eyebrows due to the height of the turbines: they are proposed to be "up to" 1,048 feet above water level, making them some of the tallest in the world. By contrast, the Ocean Wind project off Atlantic City is calling for heights of 853 feet.

Even at the proposed nine miles offshore, they will be visible on clear days.

And then, there are the whales. Strandings have been all over the news recently. There have been five in New Jersey since December, which critics say is an indication that something is wrong.

According to the Marina Mammal Stranding Center, there were 12 strandings in New Jersey in 2019 and 2020, five in 2021, and six in 2022. Data going back to 2016, prior to any activity relating to offshore wind turbines, is consistent with those numbers.

According to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, "At this point, there is no evidence to support speculation that noise resulting from wind development-related site characterization surveys could potentially cause mortality of whales."

Regardless, a number of area mayors want any such projects paused until there is more data. Their letter to Murphy and Biden reads, "While we are not opposed to clean energy, we are concerned about the impacts these projects may already be having on our environment."

Opposition has grown in the last two years, driven in part by a surge in social media activity. Many of the seemingly grass roots objections to these projects have originated outside the state. For example, Protect Our Coast New Jersey, Save Our Beach View, Long Beach Island Coalition for Wind Without Impact, and Wind Action, among others, are all tied to David Stevenson, head of the Caesar Rodney Institute, a think tank opposed to green energy projects. Stevenson has a long history of fighting renewable energy projects in other states by creating or funding what appear to be local grassroots groups, but which often are funded in part by fossil fuel industry organizations.

However, there are local organizations who want these projects paused for more study, too. One of them is Save Barnegat Bay, which since 1971 has fought to protect the bay against encroachment, overdevelopment, and the effects of both.

Executive director Britta Forsberg said the cables used to bring power from the turbines to the shore could be a concern. Plans call for them to be run across Island Beach State Park and under Barnegat Bay. They would meet the mainland at Oyster Creek, where existing infrastructure would link that power to the energy grid.

Forsberg told the county Board of Commissioners, "Our main concern ... is the impacts that this project will have on Barnegat Bay, on its critical resources."

Congressman Jeff Van Drew has announced that he plans to launch a series of public hearings on the matter throughout south Jersey, beginning this month. He also said he hopes to propose legislation that "places a moratorium on all existing projects and legislation that will prohibit all future projects."

Congressman Chris Smith also offered his opposition. He said at a rally last month, "We demand to be heard and our deep concerns addressed – not trivialized, mocked or dismissed."

Phone Scam is Targeting County Bus "Ocean Ride" Users

If you take advantage of the county's Ocean Ride program, you know how easy it is to use.

Unfortunately, scammers are using the comfort people have with the program against them. County officials said that riders are receiving calls from people claiming to represent the service, claiming the victim's account is overdue, and asking for personal information, such as account and credit card numbers. Caller ID even makes it appear as if the calls are coming from the county.

These calls are scams. County officials say the Ocean Ride program never calls users about their account status.

"Unfortunately scammers have developed sophisticated systems that look as if a call is coming from Ocean County when it is not," said Commissioners Joseph H. Vicari. "If the call does not sound legitimate, trust your instincts and reach out to Ocean Ride directly to verify."

As a general rule, you should never give out personal information to anyone who calls you, if you are not already expecting the call. If you are unsure if a call is legitimate, hang up and call the organization, bank or business directly at their published number.

are 11 scheduled routes and a ride request service, and even a phone app to make planning trips easier.

The routes focus on major population centers and popular destinations. In the Toms River area, for example, stops include the Ocean County Mall, the justice complex in downtown Toms River, Community Medical Center, shore towns like Lavallette and Seaside Heights, and more.

For Berkeley residents, there are pickups at the Walmart on Route 37, BJ Wholesale Club, and Community Medical Center. The bus operates seven days a week in the spring and summer, and Monday through Saturday in the fall and winter.

How to Use Ocean Ride

If you need a slight detour from the bus's normal route, call (732) 736-8989 and press 4. The bus will deviate one block off its original path if requested 24 hours in advance. Otherwise, you can wait at one of its scheduled stops, or even flag down your next ride at any safe spot along its normal route.

The Reserve-A-Ride program allows residents to schedule a pickup when needed, using a reservation to schedule trips ahead of time.

If you are 60 or older, or disabled, you can book a ride by dialing (732) 736-8989 and pressing 1. You may make your reservation up to four weeks ahead of time, and two weeks in advance at minimum. This service is perfect for doctors' appointments and other important engagements.

One-way fares are \$2, and just \$1 for senior citizens, college students (with ID), and the disabled who are over 18.

All of this information, including schedules and fares, is available on the Ocean Ride app, which is free on the phone app store of your choice, such as the Google Play store and the Apple AppStore.

Meanwhile, the Veteran's Transportation Service is free for Ocean "It is important for everyone to remember to never give out personal County veterans and provides transportation to area VA clinics. Trips are by reservation and must be scheduled in advance.

Ocean County veterans also have access to the Veteran's Transportation The Ocean Ride service has been helping county residents get around Service, a free service that drives them to VA clinics in New Jersey. You since 1977, especially seniors. The buses are wheelchair-friendly, there must schedule a reservation in advance. These free trips will take veterans to the VA clinic in Brick Monday through Friday; East Orange Monday mornings and Thursday afternoons; Lyons on Tuesdays; Philadelphia on Wednesdays; and Marlton on Fridays.

> For the Brick facility, call (732) 736-8989 and press 1 to schedule a pick-up up to four weeks in advance.

For the out of county facilities, call the Ocean County Veterans **Service Bureau directly** at (732) 929-2096. Please try to provide two weeks' notice if possible.

Mayor Amato to Run for State Senate

Come this time next year, Mayor Carmen Amato may have made the jump from Berkeley to Trenton. In January, Amato announced that he would be running for the State Senate seat being vacated by retiring Senator Christopher J. Connors.

"I am thrilled to announce my candidacy as I seek to represent the extraordinary people of the ninth legislative district," Amato said.

Connors has served in the State Senate since 2008, when he took over the seat from his father, Leonard T. Connors. Len Connors served in the position since 1981.

Amato's road ahead is relatively clear. He faces no opposition for the seat within the Republican Party, and is running in a district that has voted solidly Republican for decades.

Meanwhile, Councilman John Bacchione will run to fill the seat being vacated by Amato. No challengers have yet been announced.

Amato is no stranger to elections. After an attempt to run for town council in 1999, he began his political career on the Berkeley Township Board of Education in 2000, and later won a seat on the Central Regional Board of Education. In 2005, he defeated former councilman Peter J. Mustardo to join the town council. Then in 2012, he ran for mayor and won, a position he has held ever since.

"I believe my service for the past 11 years as mayor of Berkeley Township will provide great insight into the issues and concerns of all of the people who choose to call this magnificent area of the State of New Jersey home," Amato said.

It's not the first time Amato has shown interest in higher office. In 2003, for example, when then-Assemblyman Jeffrey W. Moran was set to become Ocean County Surrogate, Amato was among those who put himself forward for consideration to fill the seat. The seat ultimately went to Assemblyman Brian E. Rumpf, who is now endorsing the mayor for Senate.



"Having known Carmen Amato for over 25 years, I believe Carmen to have the passion, integrity, and knowledge necessary to be a dynamic choice to succeed my long-time partner in the ninth district, Senator Chris Connors," Rumpf said. "I look forward to working with Carmen to continue the unprecedented constituent services for which the ninth district legislative office has long been known."

In addition to his history in office, Amato has worked with the Ocean County Board of Health and the Ocean County Utilities Authority.

If elected, Amato would represent most of the Ocean County shore region from Bay Head in the north through Long

Beach Island in the south, and portions of the county from Manchester and Berkeley Townships in the north to Tuckerton and Little Egg in the south.

Though the district is considered a safe one for republicans, with GOP candidates at the state level routinely winning 60 to 70 percent of the vote, elections still have to be run and won.

For his part, Amato said he is excited about the months ahead.

It is not yet clear who Amato's running mates will be in the general election. Rumpf has received the support of the Ocean County GOP to retain his Assembly seat, but the party is recommending that Stafford Mayor Greg Myhre run for the other Assembly seat instead of sitting Assemblywoman DiAnne Gove. Those are just recommendations, however. Candidates must still compete at the Ocean County GOP convention this month.

Amato's democratic challengers are also still to be determined.

The 2023 primary elections are June 6, and the general election is November 7.

Connors, Rumpf & Gove to Introduce Legislation Requiring Schools to Report All Assaults Resulting in Injury to Police

In response to incidents involving the tragic death of Central Regional High School student Adriana Kuch, Senator Christopher Connors, Assemblyman Brian Rumpf, and Assemblywoman DiAnne Gove intend to introduce legislation that would require school officials to immediately report to the police any assault that results in the injury of a student.

student. Amending state law would provide consistency, meaning that an incident of assault would no longer be dealt with as a matter of a school's individual policy.

"Our legislation would apply to assaults resulting in injury that occurs on school grounds or school facilities.

The 9th District delegation issued the following remarks:

"Immediately following the death of Adriana Kuch, our delegation reached out to the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office to gain a better understanding of the incident and to put us in a more informed position to determine if amending existing state law is necessary and appropriate.

"After careful consideration, our delegation is drafting new legislation that would require school officials to immediately report to the police any assault that results in the injury of a

Seasonal Allergies: What Berkeley Seniors Need to Know

Spring is fast approaching, and with it will come seasonal allergies. For senior citizens, this time of year can be especially difficult. It is estimated that nearly 10 million seniors suffer from some kind of allergy-related issue, with the most common being outdoor allergens such as pollen and mold.

The most common types of allergies are typically related to pollen, dust mites, and pet dander. Pollen is the biggest culprit for seasonal allergies, as it can travel many miles from its original source. Windy days or storms may cause an increase in your symptoms.

This year, seasonal allergies are starting early for many people, thanks to an unusually warm winter.

"We've definitely seen things blooming a lot earlier this year. And we've seen people suffering from seasonal allergies much earlier this year," Dr. Rachel Dawkins with Johns Hopkins All Children's Hospital told ABC News.

Here in central New Jersey, common plants that can cause allergy flareups include maple, oak and birch trees; grasses such as timothy, Bermuda and Kentucky bluegrass; weeds like ragweed, lamb's-quarters and mugwort; and plants such as sagebrush and sunflowers. Knowing which types of pollen are most problematic in your area can help you better prepare for allergy season.

Dust mites also tend to be a problem for seniors who have pets or live near areas where there is a lot of construction debris. Pet dander can also cause allergic reactions when inhaled.

Common seasonal allergy symptoms include sneezing, coughing, congestion, itchy eyes and nose, watery eyes and runny nose. If you experience any of these symptoms during the spring, you may have seasonal allergies. If the symptoms are severe or if they persist, see a doctor for diagnosis and treatment.

Dr. Elizabeth Cornell told WTOC there are a few key ways to tell the difference between allergies and an illness.

"Your symptoms will wax and wane more with allergies. You will not have a fever. You really shouldn't have any pain," Cornell said. "Some runny nose, some stuffiness, some postal nasal drip that cause a cough. Some folks, if they touch an allergen like pollen then touch their skin, might even and get a bit of a rash."





Treating seasonal allergies usually involves avoiding triggers such as pollen, dust mites, and pet dander. For example, when doing yard work, wear a mask over your nose and mouth to minimize pollen exposure. Keep your home's windows closed during peak pollen season, too. Also, consider using an air purifier in your home to reduce airborne allergens.

There are also various medications that can be taken to alleviate symptoms, including antihistamines like Claritin and Allegra, decongestants, and corticosteroids. They can typically relieve symptoms without making you drowsy. Your doctor can advise you on the best course of treatment for your particular allergies.

If your symptoms are severe or if they linger for more than a few weeks, see your doctor to rule out other potential causes, such as asthma or a sinus infection.

It is especially important for seniors to address allergy symptoms, because persistent symptoms can lead to other chronic health issues. For example, allergies can cause difficulty breathing, which can put an elderly person at risk for pneumonia.

"If you're inhaling something that you're allergic to, not only can it trigger nasal symptoms, but it can actually trigger asthma type symptoms, as well," Dr. Erinn Gardner of Atlanta Allergy & Asthma told WSB-TV. "We're actually seeing some people who are having an increase in asthma symptoms as well, which can consist of shortness of breath, wheezing, chest tightness."

In addition to using medication, there are also lifestyle changes that can help seniors with allergies. Keeping windows closed during peak pollen times will help keep the allergens out of your home. Washing bedding and clothes frequently helps, too.

Taking proactive steps to prevent and treat allergies will help you stay healthy this season. With the right treatments and lifestyle adjustments, it is possible to enjoy allergy season while keeping your symptoms under control.

Toilets

This isn't a topic everyone usually talks about, but something we use every day. There are many different types of toilets. Some are better than others.. What makes one toilet better than another? What are some obvious differences between toilets?

So, let's talk about the different types of toilets. You can get an elongated,, round,, two pieces,, skirted, or one piece. Maybe you need a power assisted or self-scouring toilet. Toilets come in 10", 12", OR 14" rough from back wall to center of bowl depending on where the toilet flange is placed in the room. You can get special colors which are not common anymore, and may take much longer to acquire them.

Two-piece toilets are the most common as they are the most affordable. One-piece toilets are great for easy cleaning as there are less hard to reach crevices to get dirty as well as skirted toilets. Skirted toilets typically cost more to install as they are more labor intensive. Someone may decide to purchase a round front toilet for space but most love elongated toilets for the comfortability they provide. Height is always a major factor especially as we get older. A typical toilet is 15"- 15-1/2" tall and an ADA toilet is 17"-18". Toilets are rated by a MAP score with 1000 being the highest score a toilet can get. With a score of 1000 you can expect to flush just about anything. So how do you choose?

For me, I had to decide which toilets were best for our clients. We used to love Gerber. It's affordable and has a 3" flush valve which gives a great flush, but after a very few warranty clogs, we decided to change to American Standard. Gerber has a flush rating of 900 but American Standard cadet pro has a 1000 rating. So, I was thinking, how can we improve this wonderful toilet. Well, we found a self-scouring (cleaning) toilet, made by American Standard called a Vormax. So, I decided to give it a shot and where else would be the best place to test. Them out other than my personal home as well as the shop where we have multiple people using it all day. And we don't want to have to clean it every day so I put in self-cleaning Vormaxes. At my personal house I installed the one-piece American Standard Townsend Vormax for easy cleanability to keep the wife happy!! What a game changer. The office girls are happy, my wife is happy, and therefore I am as well!!

So, if your toilet is slow to flush, making loud noises while filling, constantly running, or is old and just leaking, then maybe a new upgraded toilet that uses less water, is taller, and self-cleans may be a better option than sinking good money into an old toilet. Bathroom Safety Tips and Solutions for the Elderly

A bathroom can be a dangerous place to maneuver for older individuals or people with limited mobility. The elderly are prone to injuries and accidental falls while using these facilities because of their slippery nature. The good news is that you can implement preventative measures while providing dignity and independence for the elderly. Senior Bathroom Safety Tips

Ample Lighting and Door Changes

Poor lighting leads to poor visibility, which can result in sudden falls. You can improve the safety of a bathroom by doing simple changes on the door locks and the room's lighting. The path leading to the bathroom needs to be well lit, and the bathroom should have adequate lighting. It is also essential to consider how the door swings when being open or closed. An outward-swinging door is the best option for emergencies, as it gives caregivers easy accessibility in case the senior falls against the door.

Installing Grab Bars

Grab bars offer you with support when getting in and out of the shower while preventing accidental injuries as you can hold them to prevent falls. Safety rails and grab bars can be useful, especially when installed near the toilet, as well as the shower or tub. They need to be anchored well-enough to support an adult's weight.

Put Items Within Reach

Seniors should have their clothing and towels within reach to avoid stretching out, which can cause accidents or falls. They should be placed in such a way that the elderly does not have to stretch or bend. This includes cleaning items such as shampoo and other toiletry items. The modern toilets and showers for accessible bathrooms are designed with a partitioning for placing soap, toothpaste, and paper. This helps eliminate unnecessary standing, stretching and the potential risk of accidents that come with the strenuous exercises. Mounted dispensers are also easy to install and can be easily refilled with more product when empty.

Install a Walk-In-Bathtub

If you prefer having a bathtub instead of a shower for the elderly, then you should consider buying a walk-in-bathtub. It is a great option for seniors as it minimizes the risk of falling when getting in or out of the bathtub. These tubs are designed with doors that eliminate the hassle of climbing over the edge of a traditional bathtub. Therefore, seniors just have to walk in freely. Although a walk-in-bathtub is quite expensive to buy, it is worth the investment as it helps seniors have peace of mind when taking a bath.

A Raised Toilet Seat With Arms

Seniors who experience difficulties lowering themselves onto the seat of a traditional toilet may benefit significantly from a raised toilet with arms. The modern designs come with grab bars to reduce the risk of a fall and provide further balance assistance. Adding extra grip bars on the wall can provide the elderly with something to hold onto if they slip.

Invest in a Good Transfer Bench or Shower Chair

A shower chair is a great investment especially for seniors who have difficulty staying balanced while bathing or standing. Not only do they provide stability for safe showering, but also a place to rest comfortably during the cleaning exercise. A chair with rubber tips on its legs will prevent the chair from sliding as it offers a non-slip grip. People who have difficulties getting in and out of a shower might do well with a bathtub transfer bench. It usually starts outside the tub and you can slide the seat gradually into the shower when you sit on it.

Add Non-Skid Surfaces

You can use rough-textured patterned tiles for the bathroom as they reduce the risk of slipping when getting out of the shower. Adding non-slip mats on different entry or exit points of the bathroom will be useful in providing extra grip on the feet of the seniors as they go about their cleaning. Instead of a woolen mat, consider rugs with rubber backing as they can dry easily and prevent the growth of mold.

Lower the Water Temperature

The hot water system thermostat should have a temperature that is slightly lower than normal. Skin grows thinner with age, meaning that elders are more likely to notice that the water is too hot for a shower. Furthermore, bath water can cause serious burns if the temperatures in hot water tanks have not been adjusted. The recommended water temperature should be below 120°F (49°C). You can also check the temperature using a bathtub thermometer to prevent unnecessary burns from the very hot water.

It is a good idea to start thinking more about safety at home as you or your loved ones continue to age. Most people would like to have the peace of mind that they can perform simple tasks such as going into the bathroom without any harm.
