Veterans Services Expanded with Ocean County College Access

Accessing what the Ocean County Veterans Services Bureau has to offer is a little easier, now that the Bureau has formed a partnership with the Ocean County Veteran and Military Resource Center. The Center provides support and services to veterans taking classes at Ocean County College and Kean University.

Via this partnership, a veterans service officer will be available at the college every Monday from 8am to 4:30 pm. The officer will be in Room 221 in the Jon and Judith Larson Center, where the Veteran and Military Resource Center operates.

Over 250 veterans of all ages attend classes at the campus.

"By having a veterans service officer right on campus, our veterans can tap into programs that may be available to them in a more convenient way," said Ocean County Commissioner Gary Quinn. "Ocean County has the largest veteran population in the state ... This on-campus satellite office is all part of the ongoing outreach of our veterans service bureau."

This added access is one of a number of improvements to veterans services being made in the county.

Perhaps biggest is the upcoming VA Clinic, slated to open in spring 2024. Ground was broken last spring on the new facility, which will replace the clinic in Brick Township.

The new clinic will be located at 1051 Hooper Avenue in Toms River, right near Seacourt Pavilion, and will be part of a larger complex that will include a new building for the Ocean County Board of Social Services and the county's own Veterans Service Bureau.

The new clinic will be a 68,000-square-foot facility with an outpatient clinic for veterans, parking for 480, and more. It's about twice the size of the Brick location and is expected to serve in excess of 12,000 patients a year, making it among the most active VA clinics in the state.

Ocean County has by far the most veterans of any county in the state, with over 40,000 living within its borders. Add another 30,000 vets living in nearby Monmouth County, and this region has a dense veteran population.

Those demographics helped drive the lobbying effort for this facility. Local, county, state, and federal officials all pitched in to make it happen, stretching across party lines and including democrats, republicans, and non-political advocates alike.

"The thousands of veterans in our community deserve a world-class facility that can give them the care they need right here in Ocean county," said Congressman Andy Kim.

The clinic's services will include standard primary health care, as well as dental care, mental health counseling, physical therapy, and health services geared towards female veterans. It will be just one of 10 in the state, with the next closest in Tinton Falls.

County veterans can also avail themselves of the Ocean Ride bus service.

For retirees, veterans, and the disabled in particular, the Ocean Ride service has proven to be a boon. Riders can choose between regularly scheduled routes, the Reserve-A-Ride program, and a reservation program for veterans for trips to VA clinics.

The Veteran's Transportation Service is free for Ocean County veterans and provides transportation to area VA clinics. Trips are by reservation and must be scheduled in advance. These free trips will take veterans to the VA clinic in Brick Monday through Friday; East Orange Monday mornings and Thursday afternoons; Lyons on Tuesdays; Philadelphia on Wednesdays; and Marlton on Fridays.



For the **Brick facility**, call **(732) 736-8989** and press 1 to schedule a ride up to four weeks in advance.

For the out of county facilities, call the **Ocean County Veterans Service Bureau** directly at (732) 929-2096. Please try to provide two weeks' notice if possible.

Park Expansions, Hearing on Cable Service on Agenda for Berkeley Residents

Town officials are once again looking at ways to expand or improve the facilities at Berkeley parks, with projects planned for Veterans Park, Eastern Boulevard Soccer Complex, Whispering Pines Park, and an empty lot on Butler Boulevard.

If a grant application with the state is approved, Veterans Park would receive a new walking and biking path, the latest in a series of upgrades to the town's largest (and busiest) park. The \$125,000 grant application will go before the state Department of Community Affairs (DCA) for approval.



Veterans Park is home to an array of sports fields, Cedar Creek Golf Course, and the town's annual Summerfest concert series, so it often receives priority for improvements. For example, in 2021, a heart-shaped memorial garden was created there, with help from residents Anita Morris and Michele Nesbihal, and a host of donations from the community. There, people can place flowers to honor lost loved ones.

Though it is located in Veterans Park and has been used for Memorial Day services, the garden isn't strictly for honoring those who served in the Armed Forces. It is intended to be a place where anyone can be remembered.

In 2019, the We-Go-Round was introduced there, too. It's a variation of the classic merry-go-round that is designed to accommodate almost any child.

"The We-Go-Round is an updated version of the merry-go-round, but allows kids of all abilities, including those in a wheelchair, to be able to spin around and join in on the fun with their friends and family," Mayor Carmen said.

The We-Go-Round includes a rooftop to provide shade for those inside, bench seating to accommodate all kinds of riders, and large wheel-chair accessible entry points for easy access.

Pickleball courts have also been installed at the park, and the concession stands are in the midst of renovation.

Pending approval from the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), Eastern Boulevard Soccer Complex will see a sizable expansion on just over 31 acres of space. If approved, plans call for the creation of three new soccer fields, three softball fields, as well as roller hockey facilities and parking.

For the moment, however, those are wish list items that still require an environmental assessment to meet approval by the state.

Also in the works are two new dog parks, along with parking. One is set for Whispering Pines Park, the other for an empty lot on Butler Boulevard.

A Chance to Sound Off About Your Cable Service

A public hearing on April 17 will give Berkeley residents a chance to make their voices heard regarding the town's cable franchise agreements with Cablevision aka Optimum and Comcast aka Xfinity.

Franchise agreements are what allow a cable company to operate in town. They grant a company the right to construct and maintain cable system infrastructure on public property and right of ways in town. In exchange, the company must make service available to town residents.


These contracts are not exclusive in nature. An exclusive contract would violate federal law. However, since each individual company would have to run its own lines and infrastructure, it's rare for a community to have much in the way of choice when it comes to competing cable companies offering their services.

Competing services can operate in town, but would have to invest in infrastructure to do it.

During agreement renewal negotiations, towns typically negotiate for things such as town-specific cable access channels and other services.

They also serve as an opportunity for officials to speak on behalf of resident complaints and concerns regarding their service.

The public hearing will be held April 17 at 5pm at town hall, 627 Pinewald Keswick Rd., prior to the evening's township council meeting. Members of the public will be invited to speak.

Next Step Forward in Manitou Park Revitalization

The town is taking another step towards turning a historic site into a community center, now that Langan Engineering has been hired to do environmental work at the site – "the site" being the historic Manitou Park Schoolhouse.

Though it has strong ties to the community's origins, the building has fallen apart over the years and has frequently been called an eyesore.

Built in 1929, the one-room schoolhouse in Manitou Park was first built to serve what was then the largest African-American community in Ocean County outside of Lakewood. In fact, for a time Manitou Park was one of the only primarily black communities in the region, and the schoolhouse was at the center of it.

In the decades since it closed, however, the building has fallen into disrepair. Once gone, a piece of history will be lost.

In 2019, the township secured a \$656,000 grant from the Preserve New Jersey Historic Preservation Fund to help preserve the property. The grant called for "a preservation plan to report on historical information concerning the school and neighborhood as well as a building conditions assessment, engineering report, materials conservation report, and proposals for barrier-free accessibility," according to the Department of Community Affairs.

Grants have been directed towards the schoolhouse before. In 2001, for example, a \$29,000 grant helped fund a comprehensive preservation report, an assessment of the structure, engineering reports, and more information.

Funded by the 2019 grant money, early remedial work was approved last year, the first step in a larger renovation project.

The ultimate goal is to turn the building into a community center.

Bringing in More Affordable Housing

A related project is also aimed to help revitalize the Manitou Park community. The "Autumn Ridge at Manitou Park" project spearheaded by charitable organization, *Homes For All*, will take control of 17 lots, where affordable housing will be built. This constitutes the fourth phase of ongoing efforts to bring new housing to Manitou Park.



This coincides with township efforts to work with Habitat For Humanity for the same purpose. The Northern Ocean Habitat for Humanity has worked in the Manitou Park section of town to both rehabilitate homes and to build new homes for those in need. The township has assisted with these efforts via donations.

"By working together, Berkeley Township and Northern Ocean Habitat for Humanity, are helping to build a strong and stable community," said Kristine Novakowski, Executive Director of Northern Ocean Habitat for Humanity.

Habitat for Humanity is a non-profit organization devoted to building affordable homes for people ready to take their next step in life, as well as helping to refurbish existing homes. The homes they provide are not donations. The new owners have a mortgage, taxes, utility bills – all the same things as any other homeowner. The work done to build the houses is done by volunteers, however, allowing the cost of the home to be less than normal market value.

Recipients of these homes have to prove they are ready for the responsibility through a rigorous selection process. They have to fit income requirement criteria, show an ability to pay an interest-free mortgage, and a willingness to put in the work to be a homeowner. The process is not easy, involving a mountain of paperwork and in-depth vetting to ensure the homeowner is ready, willing, and able to take on the responsibility of home ownership.

UPDATE: ANCHOR PROPERTY TAX RELIEF REBATE

As Mayor, along with the Township Council, under the leadership of Council President John Bacchione, we have always lobbied and fought for additional property tax relief for our retirees on fixed incomes and our hard working families. Last year, as part of the 2022-2023 state budget deliberations, the state eliminated the Homestead Property Tax Credit Program and replaced it with The Affordable New Jersey Communities for Homeowners and Renters (ANCHOR) property tax relief program.

Berkeley Township was one of the top municipalities in New Jersey with one of the highest amount of residents that qualified for the Homestead Benefit program. Berkeley Township homeowners, who qualified for the Homestead Benefit received an average credit of \$225 on their second quarter property tax bill. Now, instead of a credit, homeowners will receive a check or direct deposit for either \$1,500 rebate or \$1,000 rebate.

Eligible homeowners who filed the application for the ANCHOR Property Tax Relief Program by the deadline of February 28th, 2023, must have occupied their primary residence on October 1, 2019, and file or be exempt from NJ income taxes. Homeowners who earned between \$150,000 and \$250,000 in 2019 may be eligible for a \$1,000 rebate, homeowners who earned up to \$150,000 in 2019 may be eligible for a \$1,500 rebate, and renters who earned up to \$150,000 in 2019 may be eligible for a \$450 rebate.

i'm pleased to report that the state has begun making payments to qualifying homeowners. Many homeowners who have opted to receive their rebate by direct deposit, have received them. Once the state has completed paying the nearly 800,000 residents that have opted for direct deposit, paper checks will begin to be mailed mid to late April.

Residents who are concerned about not receiving their direct deposit by May 3, 2023, applicants should call 1-888-238-1233 for more information.



Vote "YES" on School Funding Bill to Support Districts Hit with Catastrophic Cuts



9th District Legislators Praise the Efforts of their Constituents for Engaging in the Legislative Process

In representing the interests of their constituents, Senator Christopher Connors, Assemblyman Brian Rumpf, and Assemblywoman DiAnne Gove voted "YES" on legislation (S-3732) to restore 66% of the funding to 168 school districts that otherwise would have their aid cut under the state school funding formula and Governor Murphy's proposed budget for the 2023-2024 school year.

Connors, Rumpf, and Gove voted against the current school funding law (S-2/A-2) which was enacted in 2018, recognizing not only that catastrophic cuts would be imposed on constituent school districts, but also that the state's school funding would become even more politicized to the detriment of thousands of students, education professionals, parents, and taxpayers.

The 9th District delegation wrote directly to Governor Murphy calling on him to veto S-2/A-2 to break with the state's policy failed education funding policies.

Connors, Rumpf, and Gove made the following statement subsequent to S-3732 passing both houses of the State Legislature and being sent to the Governor's desk:

"It's unconscionable that Trenton has allowed politics to dictate how our schools are funded for so long, after witnessing firsthand the devastating consequences for impacted school districts which were deliberately targeted under the current funding formula.

"Making this more appalling is that this was all foreseeable but, as usual in Trenton, politics won out in the end.

"Miraculously, Trenton has now seen the error of its ways and moved to restore a considerable amount of funding to school districts that have been targeted for cuts, though not all funding. While this will in no way compensate for the damage done through years of funding cuts, it is a move in the direction of reform and a clear signal that Trenton can no longer ignore the growing chorus of residents who are tired of their school districts being used as political pawns. It's not so much that corrective action is long overdue but more we should have never reached this point, especially when considering the quality of so many children's education is directly at stake.

"For our constituents, each member of our delegation supported a hostile amendment to fully restore funding to impacted school districts as opposed to just the 66% restoration of funding. Not surprisingly, this was too much for Trenton as surely State House power brokers have other plans for that funding which is, after all, taxpayer dollars.

"That being said, we want to thank the hundreds of constituents who contacted our delegation in support of S-3732 so that impacted school districts in our area receive more state funding. Your active engagement in the legislative process proved successful and it is our delegation's privilege to serve as your 9th District representatives."

Protect Your Vision: What Berkeley Seniors Need to Know About Common Eye Problems

Vision is one of our most precious senses, so it's important to take steps to protect it as we age. Older Americans in particular are more susceptible to certain vision problems, such as cataracts, glaucoma, and macular degeneration. In fact, according to the National Eye Institute, more than half of all Americans over the age of 65 have some form of vision impairment

That vision impairment isn't always mild, either. A 2003 study of Medicare claims showed that "almost 7 million Americans over the age of 65 have severe visual impairment." That study is now 20 years old, so the current number is likely higher.

That's why it's key to be able to recognize the signs early.

Both the National Eye Institute and the American Academy of Ophthalmology recommend that everyone over age 60 "get a full, dilated eye exam every two years, or more often if there is an eye disease involved."

Some of the most common conditions to be aware of are cataracts, glaucoma, and macular degeneration.

Cataracts occur when the lens of the eye becomes clouded, reducing a person's ability to see clearly. Cataracts are more common in people over 65 and can lead to blurry vision, difficulty with night vision, or even double vision. If left untreated, cataracts can eventually cause blindness

The good news is that cataract surgery is available and it often results in improved vision for many years afterwards. The procedure involves replacing the clouded lens with a clear artificial one. Note that after surgery, the patient may still need to wear glasses or contact lenses in order to achieve optimal vision.

Glaucoma is another common eye problem among older adults which is caused by increased pressure inside the eye. It usually develops slowly over time, and is often symptomless until it is too late to be treated. This can create damage to the optic nerve and can eventually lead to permanent blindness if left unchecked.



Unfortunately, glaucoma does not have any warning signs or symptoms until permanent damage has been done, so it is important to have regular eye exams in order to detect problems early.

Having no early symptoms is not unusual, according to the American Optometric Association.

"Many eye diseases have no early symptoms. They may develop painlessly, and you may not notice the changes to your vision until the condition is quite advanced," the Association said. "Wise lifestyle choices, regular eye exams and early detection of disease can significantly improve your chances of maintaining good eye health and vision as you age."

If diagnosed with Glaucoma, the doctor may prescribe special eye drops or medications that can help reduce eye pressure and protect the optic nerve. In some cases, surgery is needed to lower pressure in the eye. This can be done through laser treatments or a procedure known as trabeculectomy, which involves creating a new drainage system for the eye's internal fluid.

Finally, age-related macular degeneration (AMD) is a condition that affects the macula, a part of the retina responsible for sharp central vision. This condition can lead to blurred vision or even blindness in one or both eyes if left untreated. The most common type of macular degeneration is age-related and usually occurs after the age of 65. Treatment options vary depending on the severity of the condition but may include medications, laser therapy, or surgery.

To reduce the risk of AMD, older adults should eat a healthy diet full of fruits and vegetables, and get regular physical activity. Foods that can help with your vision include dark leafy greens, yellow and orange fruits and vegetables, fatty fish such as salmon, and nuts. It is also important to wear sunglasses in order to reduce exposure to the sun's UV rays which can further damage the macula.

Regular eye exams are important for older adults to detect and treat age-related vision problems. An eye doctor can provide the necessary advice and treatment options, as well as recommend lifestyle changes to keep your eyes healthy. Early diagnosis is key for effective treatment.

According to a 2020 study by Penn Medicine, "Missing a single ophthalmology appointment over a two-year period was associated with decreased visual acuity for patients with macular degeneration — a leading cause of permanent vision loss in the elderly."
