### Whispering Pines Dog Park and Pickleball Court Now Open

Whispering Pines Park recently became a more welcoming place for active adults and their furry friends, thanks to the opening of a dog park and pickleball courts there.

Located off Selkirk Avenue in Holiday City, Whispering Pines serves the Holiday City and Silver Ridge Park communities, and already features softball fields, restrooms, and picnic pavilion that can be reserved (by permit) by the public.

Now, an off-leash dog park and new courts are part of the package.

"We are extremely pleased to officially open these new recreation amenities at our township park near our retirement communities," Mayor Carmen Amato said.

The additions come as part of a series of park upgrades began last year at various township facilities, including Veterans Park, Eastern Boulevard Soccer Complex, and an empty lot on Butler Boulevard.

The off-leash dog park creates a third space in Berkeley where dog lovers can let their canine companions run free. Two are operated by the township – Whispering Pines and one off Butler Blvd. in Bayville – and the third, at Miller Air Park, is run by the county.

Also added was one of the fastest growing pastimes in the country: pickleball, a blend of tennis, badminton, and table tennis that is easy to learn and play regardless of skill level, hence its massive surge in popularity the last several years.

Courts were already installed at Veteran's Park last year, part of an overall upgrade that included renovated concession stands, among other planned projects. The sport has been so popular, however, town officials decided to add courts to Whispering Pines, too.

"The sport has grown tremendously, especially among our senior population," Council President John Bacchione said, saying this was "something that was requested and needed."

The same holds true for a dog park closer to the retirement communities. Dog parks have proven beneficial for dogs and their owners alike. Dogs are pack animals and naturally crave social interaction, so the socialization they receive can help prevent anxiety and fear, make them more confident and happy, and reduce the risk of aggressive behavior.

They also provide the exercise and mental stimulation dogs need. Off-leash dog parks allow for new sights, smells, and sounds, fostering good behavior and preventing boredom, which can lead to destructive behavior at home. The activity they get also helps prevent obesity, which can lead to long-term health problems.

Meanwhile, activities like pickleball provide benefits for their human owners.

Pickleball was invented in the 1960s by Joel Pritchard, Bill Bell, and Barney McCallum on Bainbridge Island, Washington. The three friends were looking for a way to keep their families entertained, so they combined elements of badminton, ping pong, and tennis to create a new game. They named it pickleball after Pritchard's dog, Pickles, who would chase after the ball and run off with it.

Today, there are over three million pickleball players in the United States alone, with the number growing rapidly in recent years.

One of the main reasons it has become so popular is that it's an easy game to learn. The rules are simple, and the court is smaller than a tennis court, so there's less ground to cover. This makes it a great option for people who are new to sports or who have physical limitations, and is why the game has been embraced by senior communities. The sport provides a similar thrill as tennis, but with less stress on your body, especially hips, knees, and joints.

The upgrades at Whispering Pines are part of an overall park improvement plan that calls for a new walking and biking path at Veterans Park, additional soccer and softball fields at Eastern Boulevard Soccer Complex, as well as roller hockey facilities and parking there.

### Understanding New Jersey Government on Election Day

Election Day is November 7 this year, giving New Jersey residents another chance to choose their representatives in government.

Of course, there isn't a single "government" on the ballot. New Jersey has multiple layers of government that each must work together in some capacity but that are also distinct and separate entities. Here is a refresher.

First, you have the local government. This includes the mayor and township council, as well as local boards of education. In Berkeley, the township council is made up of seven members, three "at-large" positions representing the entire town, and four "ward" positions who serve and are voted on only by a specific section of the community. For example, Ward 3 represents most of the Holiday City and Silver Ridge Park area. The council approves the town budget, passes local ordinances and resolutions, and other legislative aspects of local government.

The mayor, meanwhile, is the chief executive. The mayor appoints township professionals, helps draft the budget and its priorities, provides oversight to various departments, and overall guides the town's priorities.

Both the mayor and council members serve four-year terms.

This can differ from town-to-town. Berkeley, for example, has a socalled "strong mayor" form of government. Other towns in the state may have a township committee, with one member of the committee chosen as a "weak" mayor each year. Some towns do not have wards, with all council seats being "at-large." And there are other variations, too. In some towns the Business Administrator aka Township Administrator is the most powerful person in town; in others, they are not. And so on.

New Jersey also has a county level of government, run by the Board of Commissioners, formerly known as the Board of Chosen Freeholders. This five-person body plays a similar role to the township council, except at a county-wide scale. They approve budgets, decide what land gets purchased for preservation, prioritize funding for various departments and services, and so on.

Not all New Jersey counties have the same structure. Five counties have an elected county executive who is akin to a "mayor," with the commissioners serving a similar function as a town council. In Ocean County, however, the commissioners serve both a legislative and executive function, with one member chosen from among them as the Director each year. Residents do not vote on the Director.

At the state level, key positions include the governor, lieutenant governor, state senators, and state assembly members. The governor is the head of the state government and is responsible for enacting state policies, putting forward a budget, and serving as the overall leader of the state. The lieutenant governor acts as a second in command, filling in for the Governor in their absence. State senators and state assembly members are elected officials who work together to pass laws, approve budgets, and provide oversight to different departments.

The senate and assembly are similar to the U.S. senate and congress. They draft laws and regulations, with laws needing to pass both houses before going to the governor's desk for final approval or veto. Each district in the state has one senator and two assemblymen. Berkeley Township is currently in the 9th Legislative District.

Senators serve terms of four years (and once a decade, of just two years), and assemblymen serve two-year terms.

Finally is the federal government, with its three distinct branches – Executive, Legislative, and Judicial – and high-profile elections. Residents vote in the Presidential election every four years (the next in 2024), but other positions are up for reelection at different intervals. Each state has two U.S. Senators, who serve six-year terms. Each state also has an array of representatives in Congress, who serve two-year terms and who are voted on only by the people in the district they represent.

New Jersey currently has 12 congressional districts, i.e. 12 members of Congress. This number has the potential to change every 10 years based on the Census, as does the map that draws out where each district is. This is because the number of Congressional seats in each state is determined based on population. Depending on population shifts, states can gain or lose seats following the Census. States then carve up their populations into Congressional districts, which determines which seat represents which region.

For example, district lines recently switched in New Jersey. Berkeley is now split between two different congressional districts, the 2nd and the 4th. Most (but not all) of Bayville and the shore area are in the 2nd district, while the Holiday City and Silver Ridge communities, along with the rest of the western portion of town, is in the 4th district.

The dividing line cuts the Bayville portion of town roughly in half, falling a little east of Western Blvd. and zigzagging through the residential communities there.

The retirement communities in Berkley's western half (Holiday City, Silver Ridge, etc.) are in the same district (the 4th) as Toms River, Manchester, Jackson, Lakewood, and Brick in Ocean County, among others, as well as Howell, Wall, Colts Neck, Middletown, and other Monmouth County communities.

Meanwhile, the shore area (the 2nd district) encompasses pretty much all of South Jersey all the way down to Cape Map and across the western portion of the state.

Because the terms for these varied seats and levels of government vary, so do your options each Election Day. Some years will be nominated by local elections, others by the presidential election, and so on. This year, Berkeley residents will be voting for Mayor, State Senate and Assembly, Ocean County Commissioner, and other positions.

Election Day is November 7, 2023.

2nd Lowest Overall Property Taxes in Ocean County & No Municipal Tax Increase in 2023

I am pleased to report that Berkeley Township continues to have the 2nd lowest OVERALL property taxes in all of OCEAN COUNTY and the 31st lowest OVERALL property taxes out of 564 municipalities in New Jersey. This is exceptional news for our taxpayers, considering the financial challenges we have endured. This was no easy task to accomplish, especially due to the downturn of the national economy as a result of the sharp rise in inflation.

We are extremely proud to have delivered another municipal budget that keeps taxes the same as last year. NO MUNICIPAL TAX INCREASE! The municipal budget will keep our tax rate the same at \$0.705 per \$100 of assessed valuation. Keep in mind that the municipal portion, including our open space tax, is a little over 30% of the total bill. This is the ONLY portion of your tax bill under the direct control of the Mayor and Council. The remaining, nearly 70% of your bill, which includes county government, county library, county health, county open-space and the school district taxes, the Township has NO CONTROL over.

Thank you to the members of the Township Council, especially Council President John Bacchione, who chairs our Finance Committee, for working with me to keep the costs of government down. The average Berkeley Township homeowner will continue to pay less than half of the statewide average property tax bill. That is a significant accomplishment we all can be proud of.

### AA- Credit Rating Confirmed by S&P

Standards & Poor's rating service has affirmed our Bond rating at AA-. In 2019, they increased Berkeley's bond rating from an A+ to an AA-.

The S&P said, "Maintaining an AA- rating affirms our stable financial outlook and is based on the Township's strong budgetary performance, flexibility and very strong liquidity."

Once again we are extremely pleased that S&P has recognized the effort we have made to be financially responsible to our taxpayers despite these difficult economic times. The upgrade to AA- marked the second time in five-years that S&P has increased Berkeley's Bond Rating. In 2015, Berkeley moved up two notches from A- to A+ and in 2019 improved one spot to AA-. Berkeley Township has been working to ensure financially sound operations – for not only today - but the future.

### **Municipal Grant Awards Exceed \$16 Million**

We are proud to have reached over 16 million dollars in grant funding over the last 12 years. We have been extremely aggressive in applying for and receiving grant funding from various agencies. We have used the grant monies for funding new police officers, bullet proof vests, DWI enforcement and body cameras for the Police Department. The grant awards have also financed road repairs, recycling, Sandy recovery, tourism and the environment, improving our parks and repairing our public buildings. We will continue to pursue every available funding source to ensure we keep the tax burden on ourresidents as low as possible.

Considering what we have endured in the last ten years, I am really proud of what we have done to keep Berkeley Township an affordable place to live, work, raise a family and retire.

### REMINDER: PRESCRIPTION DRUG DROP OFF BOX AT POLICE HEADQUARTERS

Dispose of prescription drugs safely! I am urging Berkeley residents to clean out their medicine cabinets and safely dispose of their unused, unwanted and expired prescription medications. Our drop-off box is located at the Berkeley Township Police Department, 631 Pinewald-Keswick Road, next to our Municipal Building. For the last few years, our Township has participated in "Project Medicine Drop" where we collected unused, unwanted and expired medications at a convenient drop off location twice a year. Now we have a prescription drug drop box installed at our police station, which will allow our citizens to dispose of their unused, unwanted and expired prescription medications safely and securely 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. ### REMINDER: NIXLE INFORMATION NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

I am pleased to report that many Berkeley residents have signed up for the Township's new information notification system. However, many still have not. This service is in addition to our Reverse 9-1-1 notification system. By signing up for this service, you will receive real-time alerts and advisories directly from the Township.

During emergencies when critical information needs to be distributed, all residents will be contacted. To sign up to receive e-mails and text messages from the Nixle system, you must register. To register your e-mail address and cellular phone number go to our website www. berkeleytownship.org and click the Nixle sign up link. Or, to sign up for text messages only, simply text your zip code to 888777.

### REPORT POTHOLES AND STREET LIGHT OUTAGES

The Department of Public Works and I, are asking for your assistance in locating and reporting potholes and non-operational street lights.

Each winter season we experience wear and tear on our roadways. We realize that the harsh winter creates numerous potholes throughout our town. We are asking for the public's assistance to let us know the location of these trouble spots. Residents can call the Public Works Department at: 732-349-4616. Please provide the street and nearest cross-street.

Every year, the Township of Berkeley pays a fee to JCP&L for each street light. The Township is responsible to pay that fee whether the street light is operational or not. We are looking for your assistance in reporting non-operational street lights. If you notice a street light is not working, please write the pole number and call my office to report it. 732-244-7400 Ext: 1203 to report it.

## Holiday City at Berkeley EMS Getting Ready for the Holidays? Submitted by Phyllis Brown

All the holidays are coming! Rosh Hashanah, Halloween, Thanksgiving, Chanukkah, Christmas, New Years! Stay safe.

If you are driving consider the medications you're taking. We've responded to more than one accident where the driver thought to take prescription meds and then "only drive a few blocks". You not only put yourself in danger but others as well. If you don't know how a medication will affect you, call your pharmacist or doctor.

You know those really pretty scatter/throw rugs? Don't use them. Hang them on the wall! Give them away (to younger people and don't let them use them when you come to visit)! Sell them in your yard sale! Use them under the kitty litter box! ...Or call 911 when they trip you ...and, please, don't hit your head falling or you are going to leave your company while we take you to the hospital.

I have heard that some of our residents believe that they are not required to stop at the stop signs. Yes you are, even if you live here. Don't laugh. I have been on calls where this is the case. Even if you don't have the stop sign or red light, please be safe, slow down and look out for those who don't think they have to stop. The right away won't keep you out of the hospital, your car out of the shop or your insurance rate low.

Snow and ice can be treacherous. Use the railings. I bought "grippers" that go on the bottom my shoes to keep me from sliding.

I make sure my driveway and walkway are shoveled early so that the sun can dry them as soon as possible. If you are not able to do this yourself, please don't. Get a son, a daughter, a neighbor or one of those young people looking to make a few extra bucks to do it. Do not think you can shovel it yourself if your wife is screaming at you "Don't do it. You had a heart attack last year!" Listen to her for a change. Do you live alone? You may be one of a dozen people we picked up last year when a neighbor called 911 and said "there is a guy laying face down in the snow across the street.

Remember some medications should not be taken with a nip of Christmas cheer. If you're diabetic, maybe you should only have a slice of apple pie and not the pumpkin pie, the ice cream, my Indian pudding and Junior's cheesecake as well.

Dress for the weather and have Safe & Happy Holidays.

Leave a key somewhere or lock code so EMS can get in without breaking down your door. A neighbor with a key is good but may not be home. Lock boxes, garage door keypads, front door keypads are all good. Leave a key under the third frog from the left in the front garden. Then give the information to your Police Department. EMS gets the information on a secure device only if you call 911. Think about this before you call 911 and can't get to your door.

### Plans Coming Into Focus For Old Mall Site

The Beachwood Mall, a long abandoned retail property located in the Bayville section of Berkeley, may see life again in the years ahead, if plans brought before the township come to fruition.

Even when it was still standing, just north of the old Blackbeard's Cave site, the Beachwood Shopping Plaza had long ago turned into an eyesore. Torn down years ago, township officials have been looking for a way to revitalize the property ever since.

A presentation made last month outlined some of the possibilities for the site. M&M Realty Partners, the firm redeveloping the property, is proposing a car wash, three restaurants (including fast food), and several larger retail outlets. None of the specific chains or businesses being pursued have been named, nor has anything been approved.

A car wash has already signed a letter of intent to locate there. M&M is also under discussions with at least one national retailer to bring a 14,000-square-foot facility there. There is also a desire to locate a supermarket on the parcel.

The developer recently asked the township council to clarify some aspects of zoning on the site, to ensure a car wash would be a permitted use. The council said it was, so no zoning board approval will be required.

The site is just over 40 acres, and is also referred to as the Town Center Redevelopment Area. Previous plans have called for apartments near the rear of the property, a gas station and convenience store, though to what extent any of these plans are still being considered remains an open question.

Meanwhile, the nearby "WOBM Pit," located south on Rt. 9 behind Yesterday's, will be preserved rather than redeveloped. Earlier this year, the county made the 46-acre former sand and gravel pit the latest addition to the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust's inventory of land.

At various times, the property was slated to get high-density residential units, at one time including an apartment complex. Applications were in motion, but those plans were halted once the land was set for preservation.

The vacant property is often used by off-road vehicles. With the land now becoming part of the Natural Lands Trust, Berkeley police will be more actively monitoring the property for such activity.

Established in 1997, the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust was created to purchase and preserve environmentally sensitive lands, natural areas and open space for preservation against development. It collects funds through a 1.2-cent addition to the tax rate, and then directs those funds towards purchasing undeveloped land for the purposes of keeping that land undeveloped.

Generating about \$10 million annually, to date the Trust has protected over 25,000 acres of land in Ocean County, land which is accessible to the public for hiking, bird watching, and other passive use.



## Flu Shot Season in Berkeley Has Arrived County Has Released Its Schedule of Flu Shot Locations

When the temperatures begin to cool, autumn arrives, and winter looms, that's a signal that it's time for your annual flu shot.

Flu shots are especially important for older Americans, who are the most vulnerable population when it comes to the flu and its complications.

Influenza, or the flu, is a respiratory illness caused by viruses that affect the nose, throat, and lungs. Symptoms include fever, cough, sore throat, body aches, and fatigue. In severe cases, the flu can lead to hospitalization and even death, often because it can progress into pneumonia. The virus is highly contagious and can spread easily through sneezing, coughing, and touching contaminated surfaces.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), older adults aged 65 and above are at a higher risk of complications from the flu. In fact, the CDC reports that in recent years, between 70 to 90 percent of seasonal flu-related deaths and 50 to 70 percent of flu-related hospitalizations occurred in people aged 65 and older.

Experts say getting a flu shot can significantly reduce the risk of getting sick. In the 2019-2020 flu season, the vaccine prevented an estimated 7.5 million illnesses and 6,300 deaths, according to the CDC. The flu shot works by exposing the body to inactive or dead flu viruses, allowing the immune system to build up defenses against them.

"It takes roughly two weeks to build full protection, so we usually recommend getting vaccinated by late October, ahead of Thanksgiving travel and the typical flulike illness case rise in mid-November," Dr. Rich Wittman of Stanford University told the Stanford Report.

Effectiveness varies from year to year. Each annual shot is made to fight a variety of strains, chosen based on predictions of which will be most rampant that year. This is based on what strains were common in the southern hemisphere prior to our flu season, as this can give some indicator of which will be common here.

Getting a flu shot not only reduces the risk of getting sick but also helps lessen the severity of symptoms if one does get infected.

"The important thing to recognize is that, even if it's not a great match, everybody gets some level of an immunity boost when they get the flu vaccine, and what is most important about the flu vaccine is that it prevents you from getting severely ill and it keeps you out of the hospital," Penn Presbyterian Medical Center's Dr. Judith A. O'Donnell told Penn Today.

The CDC reports that getting a flu shot can reduce the risk of flu-related hospitalization among older adults by approximately 40 percent.

Additionally, a study by the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases found that getting a flu shot can improve the overall health of older adults, leading to fewer doctor visits, hospitalizations, and less use of antibiotics.

Flu shots are widely available and can be administered at many healthcare facilities, including clinics, pharmacies, and doctor's offices.

The Ocean County Health Department (OCHD) has scheduled a full season of vaccine clinics starting in October. These clinics have no out-of-pocket costs, with insurance documentation. Those without insurance can still receive a shot through the county's uninsured-underinsured cost program. In addition, a Homebound Flu/COVID Vaccine Program will provide service for residents who are restricted to their homes.






