

Berkeley's Solar Array Has Been Constructed

Construction on Berkeley's oft-discussed solar array has been finished and the facility will soon be ready to provide clean energy to local homeowners.

The project brings to close the story of the old Berkeley Township Landfill and begins a new story for the site.

The 10 megawatt solar field is located on 40 acres behind the town's Public Works yard on Pinewald-Keswick Road. The landfill there operated on the site until 1974, when it was closed but never capped.

Then, in 2020, the town partnered with CS Energy to finally cap the landfill for good. It took several years, but its place, a solar array has been constructed that will deliver solar energy to up to 1,800 homes in the area.

Mayor John Bacchione said earlier this year, "This project achieves many goals in Berkeley Township, which include the final capping of our long-closed landfill, providing green energy to our residents at a discounted rate, and improving the environment by reducing our carbon footprint."

In a written statement, CS Energy's VP of Development John Ervin said moving towards solar is a boon for New Jersey communities.

"In addition to closing this landfill and providing additional revenue for the city, these projects also provide a high-quality solar power plant, cleaner air, and significant energy savings to local residents long-term," Ervin said.

Many homes in Berkeley will directly benefit from the facility. Residents are able to opt-in to purchasing energy via the array, with 51 percent of them set to be low to moderate income households. Doing so is completely optional. It also won't impact how residents pay their bills, either, because their energy will still be delivered via JCP&L lines and their bills are still paid JCP&L.

The arrangement comes courtesy of the state's Community Solar Pilot Program, which allows homeowners to "participate in a solar energy project that is remotely located from their property."

Through the Community Solar Pilot Program, homeowners can sign up for a solar energy program and receive rates comparable to homeowners with panels on their home, despite not actually hosting or owning panels themselves. This means those who may not otherwise be able to afford solar power will be able to do so. It's part of an effort to increase the adoption of renewable energy sources throughout the state.

"Community Solar is a critical component of our solar programs in making sure that the clean energy and cost savings of solar are available to everyone," NJBPU President Joseph L. Fiordaliso said at a press conference earlier this year.

According to the Pew Research Center, the trend towards solar has proven popular across the country. "Majorities of Americans say the United States should prioritize the development of renewable energy sources, such as wind and solar, and take steps toward the country becoming carbon neutral," their 2022 study said. Some 75 percent of Americans say "the federal government should encourage the production of wind and solar power," according to the study.

Officials Want Your Help in Identifying Problem Traffic Areas

Ocean County and state officials want to identify problem areas on New Jersey's roadways, and they're asking for public input to help them out.

The result will be a Local Safety Action Plan, which aims to focus on areas that could use safety-related improvements and restructuring. As part of the effort, officials are asking residents to take part in an online survey to help spotlight areas that are in need of attention.

Links to the survey can be found at **www.co.ocean.nj.us**, or can be directly accessed at **Ocean.SafetyPlansNJ.com**.

According to the Project description, "Public involvement is critical to helping identify concerns and potential solutions for addressing them."

Using an interactive map, residents can submit comments and ideas for specific intersections, roadways, and other areas.

Organizers urge people to "think about safety issues that you have experienced while traveling in the highlighted counties in New Jersey and share your experiences and ideas," and then to add them to the interactive map. "You can also view the feedback others have left."

An in-person workshop is also planned for October 12 in Waretown, at the Pine Barrens Jamboree.

The effort is being funded by the North Jersey Transportation Planning Authority. Also participating in the effort are Bergen, Hunterdon, Morris, Passaic, Somerset, Sussex, and Warren counties.

Ocean County Commissioner John P. Kelly said the project is especially important in Ocean County, where roadways have grown more and more congested over the years.

"Ocean County's population continues to grow exponentially putting more motorists and pedestrians on our roads. Our population also more than doubles during the summer tourism season adding tremendously to the number of vehicles, pedestrians and bicyclists using the roads," Kelly said in a written statement. "This Local Safety Action Plan will provide us with yet another tool to help us make certain our roads are constructed and maintained as the safest transportation network possible."

Not counting local and state roads, which make up the majority of roadways in the area, Ocean County manages 1,600 miles of roadways and almost 260 culverts and bridges.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, fatalities on U.S. roadways fell in the first half of this year by 3.2 percent – but not in New Jersey, where traffic fatalities were up a whopping 22.9 percent from January to June 2024, when compared to the same span in 2023. There were 266 road deaths during that period last year, and 327 this year.

In fact, the Northeastern United States in general did not keep pace with national trends in this regard, with a 4 percent overall increase in road deaths.

The data is available at crashstats.nhtsa.dot.gov in the Traffic Safety Facts report issued in September.

Ocean County officials hope to reverse that trend locally, with the help data from this survey will provide.

"We encourage Ocean County residents to visit **Ocean. SafetyPlansNJ.com** to participate in the survey and web mapping activity," Director of the Ocean County Board of Commissioners Barbara Jo Crea said in a written statement.

Amato, Rumpf & Myhre Provide Update on ANCHOR Property Tax Relief Program

Senator Carmen Amato, jr., Assemblyman Brian Rumpf, and Assemblyman Gregory Myhre are pleased to share an important update about the ANCHOR property tax relief program. The New Jersey Department of Treasury announced that the Division of Taxation has begun the process of sending out confirmation letters to 1.5 million New Jerseyans who are eligible for this season's ANCHOR payments.

What to Expect This Season

The Division of Taxation will continue the streamlined application system that was implemented last season:

- 1. The Division of Taxation will automatically file applications for most homeowners and renters who previously received ANCHOR benefits.
- 2. Starting August 19, 1.5 million New Jerseyans will receive ANCHOR Benefit Confirmation Letters. These letters will notify recipients that their application will be filed automatically.
- 3. If personal information in the letter (name, mailing address, banking information) has changed since the last ANCHOR payment, a new application must be filed.
- 4. The deadline to update information or file a new application was September 15, 2024.

Timeline:

- 1. August 19, 2024: Mailing of ANCHOR Benefit Confirmation Letters began.
- 2. September 15, 2024: Deadline for those needing to update their information or file a new application.
- 3. November 30, 2024: Final deadline to apply for this year's ANCHOR benefit.
- 4. November 2024: Payments will be issued on a rolling basis.

"Reinstating the annual back-to-school sales tax holiday is a commonsense proposal that eases the financial burden of purchasing school


supplies," said Senator Amato. "The misguided decision to strip New Jerseyans of this critical relief has only made it harder to provide for their children's education. At a time when household budgets are being stretched thin, this tax holiday would provide meaningful relief to families and educators."

The 9th District Delegation's bill would reinstate the repealed sales tax holiday and occur during the ten-day period leading up to and including Labor Day. Under the bill the following items would be exempt from the sales tax:

- 1. Computers with a sales price of less than \$3,000 per item;
- 2. School computer supplies with a sales price of less than \$1,000 per item;
- 3. School and art supplies;
- 4. School instructional materials; and
- 5. Sport or recreational equipment

County's Flu Shot Program Gears Up This Month

In years past, when flu season has begun, the Ocean County Health Department (OCHD) has been there with its annual flu shot clinics.

This year will be no different. Clinics begin providing flu shots on October 8 and will continue through mid-December, with many of its three dozen dates available in or near Berkeley.

These clinics have no out-of-pocket costs, with insurance documentation. Those without insurance can still receive a shot through the county's uninsured-underinsured cost program. In addition, a Homebound Flu/COVID Vaccine

Program will provide service for residents who are restricted to their homes.

In addition, "this fall we are extremely pleased to announce that we are bringing back our drive-thru clinic at Ocean County College to make it even more convenient for people to get their shot," OCHD Public Health Coordinator Daniel Regenye noted.

The flu, or influenza, is a virus-driven respiratory illness that affects the nose, throat, and lungs and which causes fever, cough, sore throat, body aches, and fatigue. It's not just a cold, either. For those in certain at-risk categories (including older Americans), the flu can progress into fatal pneumonia.

Because the virus is highly contagious and can spread easily through sneezing, coughing, and touching contaminated surfaces, taking precautions is essential.

For example, in the 2019-2020 flu season, the shot prevented an estimated 7.5 million illnesses and 6,300 deaths, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

"It takes roughly two weeks to build full protection, so we usually recommend getting vaccinated by late October, ahead of Thanksgiving travel and the typical flu-like illness case rise in mid-November," Dr. Rich Wittman of Stanford University told the Stanford Report.

Ocean County's flu shot locations kick off on Oct. 8, along with weekly drive-thru availability at Ocean County College.

According to the CDC, older adults aged 65 and above are at a higher risk of complications from the flu. In fact, the CDC reports that in recent years, between 70 to 90 percent of seasonal flu-related deaths and 50 to 70 percent of flu-related hospitalizations occurred in people aged 65 and older.

Effectiveness of the shot varies from year to year. Each annual dose is made to fight a variety of strains, chosen based on predictions of which will be most rampant that year. This is based on what strains were common in the southern hemisphere prior to our flu season, as this can give some indicator of which will be trending in the coming season.

The CDC reports that getting a flu shot can reduce the risk of flu-related hospitalization among older adults by approximately 40 percent.

Additionally, a study by the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases found that getting a flu shot can improve the overall health of older adults, leading to fewer doctor visits, hospitalizations, and less use of antibiotics.

Breast Cancer in Senior Citizens: Understanding Risk Factors and Treatment

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month, and it's a topic that impacts people of all ages and genders.

In the United States, breast cancer continues to be a leading cause of death among women, including senior citizens.

According to the American Cancer Society, the risk of developing breast cancer increases as women age, and around two-thirds of invasive breast cancers are found in women over 55 years old. As such, it is essential for older Americans to understand the risk factors associated with breast cancer and what they can do to mitigate their risk.

The majority of breast cancers in senior citizens occur in women with no known risk factors. However, certain factors can increase the likelihood of developing the disease. These include a family history of breast or ovarian cancer, having dense breasts, undergoing hormone replacement therapy, and being overweight or obese.

Additionally, women who began menstruating before age 12 and those who experienced menopause after age 55 are also at a higher risk of breast cancer. Therefore, it is crucial for senior citizens to be aware of these risk factors and discuss them with their healthcare provider.

Although many risk factors are out of your control, there are several things one can do to reduce their chances of developing breast cancer. First, it is essential to maintain a healthy weight, exercise regularly, and eat a balanced diet that includes plenty of fruits, vegetables, and whole grains. Moreover, reducing alcohol consumption can also lower your risk of developing breast cancer. Women should have no more than one drink per day, and men should have no more than two drinks per day. Lastly, it is recommended that women receive mammograms annually or biennially, starting at age 50.

The American Cancer Society notes, "Mammograms are not perfect. They miss some breast cancers. And if something is found on a screening mammogram, a woman will likely need other tests (such as more mammograms or a breast ultrasound) to find out if it is cancer. There's also a small chance of being diagnosed with a cancer that never would have caused any problems had it not been found during screening." Writing for Johns Hopkins Medicine, breast surgeon Hanh-Tam Tran, M.D. said that a diagnosis at an older age is not a cause for panic.

"In patients 70 years old or older, most of the time, the invasive cancer is hormone receptor positive, which means it is a slower-growing cancer," she said. "Even when you are diagnosed at an older age, you can successfully complete your therapy, go on living ... This is especially true for those who are in good general health at the time of their diagnosis and who are able to care for themselves."

Breast cancer is treated with a variety of approaches, depending on the stage and location of the disease. Some seniors may have surgery to remove the cancerous tissue, while others may receive radiation therapy or chemotherapy. Hormone therapy may also be used to prevent the recurrence of breast cancer.

However, for older adults with other health conditions, treatment can be challenging. In many cases, doctors will weigh the benefits of treatment against the potential risks and side effects. They may also consider the individual's overall health status and life expectancy.

According to Moffitt Cancer Center, doctors face challenges when treating treat a breast cancer patient is 75 or older, specifically with regard to chemotherapy.


"They must provide the standard of care at the recommended dose while closely monitoring the patient for side effects and fine-tuning the dose as needed," the Center writes. "This is a delicate balancing act. Older adults with breast cancer are at greater risk for treatment-related side effects, but undertreatment at any age can lead to a poor outcome."

By engaging in a healthy lifestyle, remaining aware of risk factors, receiving regular screenings, and discussing concerns with your healthcare provider, older adults can reduce their chances of developing breast cancer – and if you do receive a breast cancer diagnosis, know that there are treatment options available.
